SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR BOTH EVENTS

1. Announcement

The Windsor Car Club will promote a Navigational Scatter on Saturday 17th September 2016 and a Touring Assembly on Sunday 18th September 2016, both starting at the Holiday Inn Reading West, on the A4 near Reading (GR 175/605677) and finishing at the same location.

2. Jurisdiction

Both events will be held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association Ltd., these regulations and any additional instructions that may be issued for each event.

3. Eligible Cars and Participants

The events are open to four-wheeled road cars manufactured before 31st December 1995, plus any other cars that the organisers consider as “classics”. Please ask if you are unsure of your car’s eligibility.

All cars must meet the legal requirements to run on the road. The use of trade plates is not permitted

Advertising, trade signs or promotional displays may not be carried on any vehicle. “Period” advertising will be considered, but must be defined on the entry form, and is subject to the organiser’s approval. Cars contravening this rule will be required to cover the offending advertising before starting.

Only cars that have passed scrutineering will be allowed to take part.

Decisions on the eligibility of entries are at the absolute discretion of the organisers and are final.

4. Identification

Participating cars will be identified by a “Rally Plate” to be provided by the organisers. This should be affixed to the front of the vehicle.

5. Documentation

All drivers must hold a valid full driving licence. A competition licence is not required.

At the start of each part of the event participants will be issued with detailed instructions to enable them to complete the event, also additional, optional, supplementary information may be issued from time to time.

6. Insurance

Participants will be required to sign a declaration that they have valid insurance, in accordance with Road Traffic Act requirements.

7. Entries

Entries open on publication of these regulations and close on 11th September 2016. A maximum of 40 entries will be accepted.

All entries must be accompanied by the full entry fee, either by cheque or by bank transfer. Post dated cheques will not be accepted.

8. Acknowledgement of entries and final instructions.

Entries will be acknowledged by email. Final instructions will be sent by email one week before the event unless a posted "hard-copy" is specifically requested.

9. Cancellation of Entries

Entrants may cancel their entry any time up to the closing date for entries, and will have their entry fee refunded less a £10 administration charge. After the closing date entrants who cancel, or who fail to arrive at the start will forfeit their entire entry fee.

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS FOR SATURDAY 17th SEPTEMBER 2016

11. Jurisdiction

The MSA Clubman's Permit number TBA has been issued for the event.

12. Clerk of the Course – Terry Schraider

13. Eligible Cars and Participants

Cars must have no more than four forward facing light beams and auxiliary lights must extinguish when dipped beam is selected. Also reversing lights must either be operated by selecting reverse gear, or by a switch with an associated warning light.

To compete in a "Clubman's" event drivers must be members of a participating club, thus membership of the HRCR, or the Windsor Car Club (WCC) is required. Membership of the Windsor Car Club for the remainder of 2016 is available for a small fee.

14. Route Information

The event will all be confined to Ordinance Survey Landranger Maps 174, 175 although the maps will not be required as a copy of the appropriate part of the map will be supplied. Entrants will be expected to choose their own route to visit a maximum of 12 out of 16 defined locations and to answer a simple question at each location. To complete the event crews will need to travel approximately 30 miles.

15. Awards

Each of the event's locations will have a pre-defined score and an award will be presented to the crew having the highest accumulated score. Should it be necessary a tie decider will be used.



SPECIFIC REGULATIONS FOR SUNDAY 18th SEPTEMBER 2016

16. Jurisdiction

The MSA Certificate of Exemption number TBA has been issued for the event.

17. Clerk of the course – Terry Schraider

18. Route Information

The route will consist of 100 miles on public roads with two rest breaks. The route is confined to Ordinance Survey Landranger Maps 174 and 175 although the maps will not be required to complete the event.

A detailed roadbook will provide all of the information necessary to complete the route.

In order to successfully complete the route, cars should be fitted with a working odometer. Specialist trip meters are permitted.

19. Entry Priority

Up to the 18th August priority will be given to entries received from people who have already reserved places. After that date entries will be accepted in the order in which they are received. People who do not wish to take up their reserved entry must inform the Secretary before the 18th August in order to recover their deposit. After that time the deposit will be forfeited.

20. Checkpoints

The route will include checkpoints at the start, the Rest Halts and the finish. Participants will be expected to arrive at these during their defined open times, and leave at specific times.

21. Driving Skill

A small number of simple tests will be included at the finish venue to allow drivers to demonstrate how well they know their car. All of these tests will concentrate on driver's knowledge of their car and their ability to manoeuvre it in normal motoring situations.

All of these tests will be untimed.

Drivers performance in these tests will be marked, and a prize will be awarded for the best score.

22. Meal Information

A 'Rally Breakfast' of a bacon sandwich and a hot drink will be provided at the start of the event and afternoon tea will be provided at the finish.

Vegetarian, and other special dietary requirements may be met if notified in advance.

23 Other Information

A professional motor sport photographer will be present during the event.
